#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The 10<sup>th</sup> Special Session of the International Pacific Halibut Commission (IPHC) (SS010) was held electronically, on 22 February 2021. The meeting was opened by the Chairperson Mr Glenn Merrill (USA), who outlined the need for a Special Session.

The following are the actions arising from the SS010, which are also provided at Appendix V.

#### IPHC PACIFIC HALIBUT FISHERY REGULATIONS 2021

Contracting Party Fishery Regulation Proposal:

Recreational (Sport) Fishing for Pacific Halibut—IPHC Regulatory Area 2B (Sect. 28)

(<u>para. 7</u>) The Commission **ADOPTED** amendments to Section 28, paragraph (c) of the IPHC Fishery Regulations (2021) and as provided in <u>Appendix IV</u>:

"(c) the daily bag limit is two (2) Pacific halibut of any size per day, per person, except that between 1 April 2021 and 31 March 2022 only, DFO may implement a daily bag limit of three (3) Pacific halibut per day, per person."

#### REQUESTS

SS010–Req.01 (para. 8) The Commission **REQUESTED** that the IPHC Secretariat make the adopted amendments to Section 28, paragraph (c) of the IPHC Fishery Regulations (2021), and for these to be submitted to the Contrating Parties after the current amendments (from AM097) are confirmed by both Parties. The expectation is that the amendments to Section 28, paragraph (c) would be in place prior to 1 April 2021.

#### 1 OPENING OF THE SESSION

1. The 10<sup>th</sup> Special Session of the International Pacific Halibut Commission (IPHC) (SS010) was held electronically, on 22 February 2021. The meeting was opened by the Chairperson Mr Glenn Merrill (USA) who outlined the need for a special session.

#### 2 ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA AND ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE SPECIAL SESSION

2. The Commission **ADOPTED** the Agenda as provided at <u>Appendix I</u>. The documents provided to the SS010 are listed in <u>Appendix II</u>. The list of participants is provided at <u>Appendix III</u>.

#### 3 IPHC FISHEY REGULATIONS (2021)

#### 3.1 Contracting Party Fishery Regulation Proposals

#### 3.1.1 Recreational (Sport) Fishing for Pacific Halibut—IPHC Regulatory Area 2B (Sect. 28)

- 3. The Commission **NOTED** fishery regulation proposal IPHC-2021-SS010-PropB1 which proposed amending Section 28 of the IPHC Fishery Regulations (2021) by increasing the Pacific halibut daily limit from two (2) per day to three (3) per day in IPHC Regulatory Area 2B.
- 4. The Commission **NOTED** that the distributed mortality limit for IPHC Regulatory Area 2B (Table 6 of IPHC-2021-AM097-R) and sector (as provided in Appendix IV of IPHC-2021-AM097-R) would remain in place, irrespective of the proposed amendment by Canada.
- 5. The Commission **NOTED** Canada's intention to impose the following licence conditions in 2021:
  - a) No person shall catch and retain more than ten (10) Pacific halibut in the aggregate from 1 April 2021 to 31 March 2022;
  - b) No person shall retain a Pacific halibut greater than 133 cm head-on length;
  - c) If the Daily Limit is one (1) or two (2), the Possession Limit is EITHER of: one (1) Pacfiic halibut measuring from 90 cm to 133 cm head-on length OR two (2) Pacific halibut measuring under 90 cm head-on length;
  - d) If the Daily Limit is three (3), the Possession Limit is EITHER of: one (1) Pacific halibut measuring from 90 cm to 133 cm head-on length OR three (3) Pacific halibut measuring under 90 cm head-on length.
- 6. **RECALLING** that all Sessions of the Commission are open to the public, the Commission **CONSIDERED** public comments from both Canadian and U.S.A. stakeholders.
- 7. The Commission **ADOPTED** amendments to Section 28, paragraph (c) of the IPHC Fishery Regulations (2021) and as provided in <u>Appendix IV</u>:
  - "(c) the daily bag limit is two (2) Pacific halibut of any size per day, per person, except that between 1 April 2021 and 31 March 2022 only, DFO may implement a daily bag limit of three (3) Pacific halibut per day, per person."
- 8. The Commission **REQUESTED** that the IPHC Secretariat make the adopted amendments to Section 28, paragraph (c) of the IPHC Fishery Regulations (2021), and for these to be submitted to the Contrating Parties after the current amendments (from AM097) are confirmed by both Parties. The expectation is that the amendments to Section 28, paragraph (c) would be in place prior to 1 April 2021.

#### APPENDIX IV

## SECTION 28. RECREATIONAL (SPORT) FISHING FOR PACIFIC HALIBUT—IPHC REGULATORY AREA 2B

- (1) In all waters off British Columbia: 6,7
  - (a) the recreational (sport) fishing season will open on 1 February unless more restrictive regulations are in place;
  - (b) the recreational (sport) fishing season will close when the recreational (sport) fishery limit allocated by DFO is taken, or 31 December, whichever is earlier; and
  - (c) the daily bag limit is two (2) Pacific halibut of any size per day, per person, except that between 1 April 2021 and 31 March 2022 only, DFO may implement a daily bag limit of three (3) Pacific halibut per day, per person.
- (2) In British Columbia, no person shall fillet, mutilate, or otherwise disfigure a Pacific halibut in any manner that prevents the determination of minimum size or the number of fish caught, possessed, or landed.
- (3) The possession limit for Pacific halibut in the waters off the coast of British Columbia is three Pacific halibut <sup>6,7</sup>.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>6</sup> DFO could implement more restrictive regulations for the recreational (sport) fishery, therefore anglers are advised to check the current Federal or Provincial regulations prior to fishing.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>7</sup> For regulations on the experimental recreational fishery implemented by DFO check the current Federal or Provincial regulations.
