EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The 14th Special Session of the International Pacific Halibut Commission (IPHC) (SS014) was held electronically, on 31 October 2024. The meeting was opened by the Chairperson Mr Paul Ryall (Canada) who outlined the need for a Special Session to facilitate a decision in November regarding the scope of the 2025 Fishery Independent Setline Survey (FISS).

The following are the actions arising from the SS014, which are also provided at Appendix IV.

REQUESTS

2025 AND 2026-29 FISS DESIGNS

- SS014-Req.01 (para. 5) The Commission **REQUESTED** the Secretariat provide an intersessional decision paper no later than 7 November 2024, containing the following elements:
 - a) A 2025 FISS design the combines Options 2 and 3 from paper <u>IPHC-2024-SS014-03</u> (Table 3; 2A(1), 2B (1), 2C (1), 3A(2), 3B(2), 4A/4B(1));
 - b) A budget deficit for the FISS in FY2025 of approximately US\$1.2 m, while also seeking to reduce FISS costs;
 - c) A proposed decision for the Commission on the movement of funds from Fund 50 Reserve, to Fund 40 FISS, for FY2025.
- SS014-Req.02 (para. 6) The Commission **REQUESTED** the Secretariat consider other savings in the IPHC budget for consideration by the Commission at FAC101.

1 OPENING OF THE SESSION

1. The 14th Special Session of the International Pacific Halibut Commission (IPHC) (SS014) was held electronically, on 31 October 2024. The meeting was opened by the Chairperson Mr. Paul Ryall (Canada), who outlined the need for a Special Session to facilitate a decision in November regarding the scope of the 2025 Fishery Independent Setline Survey (FISS).

2 ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA AND ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE SPECIAL SESSION

2. The Commission **ADOPTED** the Agenda as provided at <u>Appendix I</u>. The documents provided to the SS014 are listed in <u>Appendix II</u>. The list of participants is provided at <u>Appendix III</u>.

3 2025 AND 2026-29 FISS DESIGNS

3. The Commission **NOTED** paper <u>IPHC-2024-SS014-03</u> that provided the Commission with the information requested, including the optional long-term FISS design, 2025 interim design options, potential external funding sources, as well as an examination of potential biases that may result from non-optimal designs.

4. The Commission **NOTED** that:

- a) preliminary 2024 FISS data suggest continued declines in average catch rates in most IPHC Regulatory Areas, indicating that even the lowest cost 2025 designs would result in operating losses:
- b) the starting point in developing a design for 2025 is therefore not a revenue-neutral design, but one that maintains sampling in all IPHC Biological Regions to provide basic data for the IPHC stock assessment, while aiming to limit the financial loss;
- c) only two charter regions, one each in IPHC Regulatory Areas 2B and 2C, are projected to be revenue-positive in 2025;
- d) supplementary funding from the USA totaling US\$387,000 has been made available for sampling 60 stations in each of IPHC Regulatory Areas 4A/4B and IPHC Regulatory Area 2A (these two sets of 60 stations are each considered to be a single charter region when projecting costs).
- e) the IPHC Fund 40 FISS, at the end of FY2024 had a negative balance. In FY2024, the income versus expenses on an accrual basis was approximately -US\$116K (pending finalisation). The Commission has an aspirational goal of maintaining a Fund 40 balance of US\$1.5M.
- f) the IPHC Fund 50 Reserve, will have a balance of approximately US\$3.0M once the accounts have been finalised and unspent funds from FY2024 are moved to the Reserve from Fund 10 General, Fund 20 Research, and Fund 30 Statistics. The Commission goal has an aspirational goal of maintaining a reserve of US\$2.0M for general operating expenses.
- 5. The Commission **REQUESTED** the Secretariat provide an intersessional decision paper no later than 7 November 2024, containing the following elements:
 - a) A 2025 FISS design the combines Options 2 and 3 from paper <u>IPHC-2024-SS014-03</u> (Table 3; 2A(1), 2B (1), 2C (1), 3A(2), 3B(2), 4A/4B(1));
 - b) A budget deficit for the FISS in FY2025 of approximately US\$1.2 m, while also seeking to reduce FISS costs;
 - c) A proposed decision for the Commission on the movement of funds from Fund 50 Reserve, to Fund 40 FISS, for FY2025.
