





2018 Commercial – Canada (BC)

24 March to 7 November

Quota Share Fisheries

Fishery Limit = 5.3 MIb (2,402 t)

- 100% landed (5.3 Mlb, 2,401 t)
- 99% of Fishery limit (6.1 Mlb) landed in 2017





2018 Commercial – USA (WA, OR, CA)

Treaty Indian commercial

- Fishery limit = 0.39 Mlb (177 t)
- Several openers from 24 Mar to 23 May
 - Unrestricted fisheries
 - 24 Mar to 28 April (36 hrs)
 - 4 May to 23 May (30 hrs)
 - Restricted fishery
 - Open 24 Mar to 28 Apr (37 hrs) 500 lb
- 4% over fishery limit (0.40 Mlb, 183 t)

Directed commercial

- Fishery limit = 0.20 Mlb (92 t)
- Three 10-hr fishing periods (27 Jun, 11 Jul, 25 Jul)
- 1% over fishery limit (0.20 Mlb, 92 t)





HALIBUT COMMISSION

2018 Commercial – USA (WA, OR, CA)

Incidental commercial catch with salmon troll fishery

- Fishery limit = 0.04 Mlb (16 t)
- Open 1 May 8 Aug (closed 14 to 24 July)
- One in-season action changing landing ratio and trip maximum
 - 1:2 plus 1, max 25 → 1:3 plus 1, max 10
- 2% under fishery limit (0.04 Mlb, 16 t)

Incidental commercial catch with sablefish fishery

- Fishery limit = 0.05 Mlb (23 t)
- Open 1 Apr 31 Oct
- 13% under fishery limit (0.04 Mlb, 20 t)





2018 Commercial – USA (AK)

24 March to 7 November

Quota Share Fisheries

Fishery Limit = 17.5 Mlb (7,956 t)

- 95% landed (16.7 Mlb, 7,575 t)
- 97% of fishery limit (15.6 Mlb) landed in 2017



Annette Island Reserve Fisheries

IPHC REGULATORY AREA 2C

- no catch limit
- 0.03 MIb (14 t) landed
- 14 two-day openings between 23 March and 30 September

HALIBUT COMMISSION

2018 Recreational – Canada (BC)

Allocation = 0.93 Mlb (421 t)

Tidal license fishery (1 Feb):

- Max length of 115 cm
- Daily limit of 1 Pacific halibut; possession limit 2 Pacific halibut, only 1 may be over 83 cm
- Annual limit 6 per license holder

14% under allocation (0.80 Mlb, 364 t)



Experimental Recreational Quota (XRQ) – leased from the Commercial Quota Fishery

- 16,648 lb (7.6 t) landed



2018 Recreational – USA (WA, OR, CA)

Allocation = 0.49 Mlb (220 t) Landed catch = 0.46 Mlb (96%)

<u>California</u>

0.03 Mlb (14 t)

<u>Oregon</u>

0.21 Mlb (96 t)

Washington

Overall, 4% under allocation (0.46 Mlb, 211 t)

IPHC Regulatory Area 2C - charter sector (guided)

- Allocation = 0.81 Mlb (367 t)
- Daily bag limit of 1 fish
- Reverse slot limit
 - total length \leq 38 inches or \geq 80 inches
- 10% under allocation (not including GAF, 0.73 Mlb, 331 t)
- Guided Angler Fish (GAF)– leased from the Commercial Quota Fishery
 - 64,365 lb (29 t) landed





2018 Recreational – USA (AK)

All areas open 1 Feb - 31 Dec – projected values

IPHC Regulatory Area 3A – charter sector (guided)

- Allocation = 1.79 Mlb (812 t)
- Daily bag limit of 2 fish
- Max size limit for 2nd fish of 28 inches
- Each vessel limited to 1 trip per day
- Closed Wednesdays
 - and 10 Jul, 17 Jul, 24 Jul, 31 Jul,7 Aug and 1 Aug
- Annual limit of 4 fish
- 4% over allocation (not including GAF, 1.87 Mlb, 845 t)



- Guided Angler Fish (GAF) leased from the Commercial Quota Fishery
 - 9,052 lb (4.1 t) landed

Private anglers (unguided) in all areas

- 2 fish daily bag limit
- No size restrictions
- No annual limit
- 3.16 Mlb (1,432 t) no allocation



Concerns with Mortality Estimates

Commercial – U.S.A.

- Discard mortality in Alaska
 - inaccurate mean fish weight
 - No observer coverage for vessels less than 40 feet
 - Hook and line observer coverage is 7% in GOA and 10% in Bering Sea
- **Recreational Canada and U.S.A**
- Self reporting of lodges in BC and AK
- No discard mortality reported for WA and CA
- OR discard mortality rolled over

Subsistence – Canada and U.S.A.

- Roll over since 2007 (Canada) and 2016 (U.S.A AK)
- Bycatch in other fisheries U.S.A.
- Hook and line observer coverage is 7% in GOA and 10% in Bering Sea
- Non-pelagic trawl catcher vessel observer coverage is 8% in GOA
- Challenges with tendered versus non-tendered deliveries



2018 Port Highlights

Canada

- Adding collection of marine mammal details to logbook – agreement with USA logbooks
- FLOAT logs collected in field via bluetooth from skipper's device to IPHC port sampler's device





2018 Port Highlights

Tissue Sampling Coastwide

- Determine sex of commercial catch
 → to inform stock assessment
- Fin clip from every sampled fish
- Initial lab prep completed in field

USA

- Seward greatest amount of landings (weight)
 - Homer boats landed in other ports early on in the season.
 - Kodiak had slower start with more boats landing in Seward.
- Pot gear for Pacific halibut in the IFQ sablefish fishery has been confusing and challenging (esp. Seward) with respect to logbook records – additional training requested, especially for vessels <60 feet (new log)





2018 Port Highlights



Head-on requirement

- Implemented in 2017
- Fresh landings with head off
 - none in USA (2017 and 2018)
 - Canada
 - 11,821 lb (5.4 t or 0.2%) 2018
 - 6,186 lb (2.8 t or 0.09%) 2017
- Frozen landings with head off
 - none in USA (2017 and 2018)
 - Canada
 - 92,148 lb (41.8 t or 2%) 2018
 - 78,583 lb (35.6 t or 1%) 2017
- Challenges for industry
 - matching their head-off weight prices to the IFQ weight
