



Total Pacific Halibut Removals Relative to the TCEY



Quota Share Fishery


Fishery Limit = 2,585 tonnes (5.7 million pounds)

- **2,488 tonnes landed** (5.5 million pounds)
- 4% under the fishery limit

2022 Directed Commercial – U.S.A. (WA/OR/CA)

Treaty Indian directed commercial

- Fishery limit = 226 tonnes (0.5 million pounds)
- Openers by tribe
 - Unrestricted fisheries

6 March to 31 May

- 55 hours
- Restricted fisheries

6 March to 31 May

- 122 hours
- 0.2 tonnes (500 pounds) per day & 5 fishing days (max)
- 3 June to 30 September
- 48 hours and 72 hours
- 226 tonnes landed (0.5 million pounds)
- 100% of the fishery limit

Directed commercial

- Fishery limit = 115 tonnes (0.3 million pounds)
- Three 58-hr fishing periods (28-30 June, 12-14 July, 26-28 July)
- 4% under fishery limit 109 tonnes (0.2 million pounds)






2022 Incidental Commercial – U.S.A. (WA/OR/CA)

Salmon troll fishery

- Fishery limit = 20.2 tonnes (0.04 million pounds)
- Open 1 April to 31 October
- No in-season limit action
 - 1:2 plus 1, max 35
 - Extension on 1 July with same ratio and landing limit
- **12 tonnes landed** (0.03 million pounds)
- **39% under** fishery limit


Sablefish fishery

- Fishery limit = 23 tonnes (0.05 million pounds)
- Open 1 April to 31 October
- One in-season action
 - 225:1000 plus 2 ▶ 150:1000 plus 2 (9 May)
- **28 tonnes landed** (0.06 million pounds)
- 22% over fishery limit

2022 Directed Commercial – U.S.A. (AK)

6 March to 7 December

Quota Share Fishery

Fishery Limit = 9,757 tonnes (21.5 million pounds)

- **8,277 tonnes landed** (18.2 million pounds)
- **15% under** the fishery limit


Annette Island Reserve Fishery IPHC REGULATORY AREA 2C

- No fishery limit
- 14 tonnes landed (0.03 million pounds)
- 11 two-day openings between 6 May and 2 October

2022 Recreational – Canada (BC)

Allocation = 458 tonnes (1.01 million pounds)

- 427 tonnes landed (0.94 million pounds)
- 7% under the fishery limit

Tidal licence fishery (1 Mar):

- Max length of 133 cm
- Daily and possession limit of 1 Pacific halibut 90-133 cm
 OR 2 Pacific halibut if both under 90 cm
- Annual limit 10 per licence holder
- In-season action (20 August)
 - Possession limit increased to 3 Pacific halibut if all were under 90 cm
 - Annual limit still 10 per licence holder

Experimental Recreational Quota (XRQ)

- Leased from the Commercial Quota Fishery
- Estimated removals at 4 tonnes (0.01 million pounds)





2022 Recreational – U.S.A. (WA, OR, CA)

Allocation = 282 tonnes (0.6 million pounds) 213 tonnes landed (0.5 million pounds) 24% under the fishery limit

California

18 tonnes (0.04 million pounds)3% over the fishery limit

<u>Oregon</u>

82 tonnes (0.18 million pounds) 37% under the fishery limit

Washington

113 tonnes (0.25 million pounds) 16% under the fishery limit

IPHC Regulatory Area 2C - charter sector (guided)

- Allocation = 372 tonnes (0.82 million pounds)
- 366 tonnes landed (0.81 million pounds)
- 2% under fishery limit
- Daily bag limit of 1 fish
- Reverse slot limit
 - Fork length \leq 40 inches or \geq 80 inches
- Guided Angler Fish (GAF) leased from the Commercial Quota Fishery
 - **45 tonnes landed** (0.10 million pounds)





2022 Recreational – U.S.A. (AK)

All areas open 1 Feb - 31 Dec - projected values

IPHC Regulatory Area 3A – charter sector (guided)

- Allocation = 957 tonnes (2.11 million pounds)
- **798 tonnes landed** (1.76 million pounds)
- 17% under fishery limit
- Daily bag limit of 2 fish
- Max size limit for second fish of 28 inches (71.1 cm)
- Each vessel limited to 1 trip per day
- Wednesday closures

Guided Angler Fish (GAF)

- Leased from the Commercial Quota Fishery
- 3 tonnes landed (0.006 million pounds)

Open 1 Feb - 31 Dec – projected values

IPHC Regulatory Area 2C – Unguided Recreational Fishery (private anglers)

• **510 tonnes landed** (1.13 million pounds)

IPHC Regulatory Area 3A – Unguided Recreational Fishery (private anglers)

- 536 tonnes landed (1.18 million pounds)
- 2-fish daily bag limit
- Possession limit: 2 daily bag limit
- No size restrictions

- 11 tonnes (0.02 million pounds)
- 18 tonnes (0.04 million pounds) in 2020

U.S.A. – AK

- 242 tonnes (0.53 million pounds)
- 242 tonnes (0.53 million pounds) in 2020
