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# INTERNATIONAL PACIFIC HALIBUT COMMISSION INTERIM MEETING 2015 AND PRELIMINARY STAFF HARVEST ADVICE (DECISION TABLE)

The International Pacific Halibut Commission (IPHC) conducted its Interim Meeting at the Hotel Deca in Seattle on December 1 and 2, 2015. #### The 2015 Stock Assessment

As has been the case since 2012, this year's stock assessment is based on an ensemble of models, thereby incorporating the uncertainty within each model as well as the uncertainty among models. This approach reduces potential for abrupt changes in management quantities as improvements and additional data are added to individual models, and provides a more realistic perception of uncertainty than any single model, and therefore a stronger basis for risk assessment. As in 2014, the models included in the ensemble consist of two long time-series models, reconstructing historical dynamics back to the beginning of the modern fishery, and two short time-series models incorporating data from 1996 to the present, the period when all sources of removals and surveys are available for all regions. For each time-series length there are two models, one fitted to coastwide aggregate data and the other to data disaggregated into geographic regions.

The results of the 2015 stock assessment indicate that the Pacific halibut stock declined continuously from the late 1990s to around 2010. That trend is estimated to have been a result of decreasing size at age, as well as recent recruitment strengths that are smaller than those observed during the 1980s and 1990s. Since then, the estimated female spawning biomass appears to have stabilized near 200 million pounds, with slightly increasing trends. Comparison with previous stock assessments indicates that the 2015 results are very consistent with estimates from 2012 through 2014 for the recent time period.

### Preliminary Staff Harvest Advice (Decision Table) for 2016

The IPHC staff harvest advice is prepared for the Commission's consideration as it sets the annual catch limits. The staff harvest advice is summarized in a decision table (Table 1, next page), which presents estimates of risk over a range of potential harvest choices for 2016 (the rows) as measured by different stock and fishery metrics (the columns). Refinements in the decision table directed by the Commission at the Interim Meeting will be included in the final staff harvest advice presented at the Annual Meeting in January. Alternative metrics of performance, as well as different increments of total removals, may be considered in the Commission's decision-making process.

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Table 1. 2016 Preliminary Decision Table, with the probabilities of various risks (columns) given alternative harvest levels (rows).

Values in the table represent the probability, in "times out of 100," of a particular risk. Total removals include all halibut mortality caused by humans, i.e., all removals except natural mortality. The Blue Line (shown as the darker shaded area in middle of this table) represents the application of the current harvest policy to the stock assessment results. The status quo line corresponds to the catch levels approved for 2015.

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#### Harvest Policy Results for 2016

The most recent apportionment estimates and the current harvest policy produce the "Blue Line" harvest option of Table 1 (shown as the darker shaded row in the table), with a coastwide Fishery Constant Exploitation Yield (FCEY) of 26.6 Mlb. It should also be noted that the current harvest policy is under review through the Management Strategy Evaluation process with the Management Strategy Advisory Board (MSAB).

The apportionment results and the Blue Line harvest level by regulatory area – as an example only – are presented in Table 2. For comparison, the 2014 and 2015 Blue Line catch levels and the *status quo* of carrying the 2015 catch levels forward for 2016 are also presented in Table 2. Catch tables for other choices of removals will be provided in the Report of Assessment and Research Activities.
