Oregon All-Depth Sport Fishery Closed Until August

The estimated harvest from the recent June 17-18 opening in the Oregon Central Coast all-depth sport spring halibut fishery is 23,393 pounds, resulting in a total of 132,097 pounds being landed. This is 2,059 pounds over the spring allocation. Therefore, the spring Central Coast all-depth sport halibut fishery is now closed. The quota overage from the spring all-depth fishery will be deducted from the summer all-depth fishery, resulting in a revised quota of 49,544 pounds. The summer Oregon Central Coast all-depth sport halibut fishery is scheduled to open on August 5-6 and every other subsequent Friday and Saturday until the quota is taken, or until October 31.

Halibut anglers are reminded that the Oregon Central Coast nearshore (<40 fathom) fishery is open seven days per week until the quota is caught. The South of Humbug subarea is also open seven days a week until October 31 or until its quota is reached. Each angler is allowed one fish per day of any size in these subareas.
