
TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

The Fisheries, Aquatic Science, and Technology (FAST) Laboratory at Alaska Pacific University (APU) in Anchorage, Alaska, is hereby granted permission to collect and retain 60 live Pacific halibut (*Hippoglossus stenolepis*) for research purposes in 2019. These fish will be collected from Resurrection Bay and transported to the Alutiiq Pride Shellfish Hatchery (APSH), in Seward, Alaska. Collection and transport are to occur between 1 May, 2019 and 31 December, 2019. Fish will be collected using charter vessels as specified by the responsible person at APU, Dr. Nathan Wolf, Principal Researcher at the FAST Laboratory and Assistant Professor at the Department of Marine and Environmental Sciences at APU (907) 564-8202.

APU is requested to notify the IPHC after each collection and transport of Pacific halibut to the APSH. In addition, the APU is requested to notify the IPHC when the total number of Pacific halibut collected and transported to the APSH is reached.

Pacific halibut obtained under this permit may not be retained for purposes other than scientific research and may not be sold. Pacific halibut captured in excess of the limits specified in this permit must be returned to the sea with a minimum of delay and injury.
